To register to vote where you live now, visit [sos.ga.gov](http://sos.ga.gov) to apply online or print an application. You can also have a Georgia Voter Registration application mailed to you by calling the Georgia Secretary of State's office at 404-656-2871 or the DFCS' Customer Contact Center at 877-423-4746. To contact the SNAP Customer Contact Center, call toll-free at (877) 423-4746 or visit your local DFCS office. For language assistance, contact LEPSI. After applying for SNAP benefits, you or a member of your household must complete a phone interview conducted by an eligibility worker at DFCS. The person who is interviewed should be ready to answer questions related to your household situation. For elderly/disabled individuals, an interview can be completed by telephone through Senior SNAP, a simplified application process designed to make it easier for seniors to receive SNAP benefits. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Constituent Services. All SNAP recipients are required to complete a periodic review to continue their eligibility for benefits. A renewal form and any required verification can be submitted in Georgia Gateway or by using Form 508 - FOOD STAMP / MEDICAID / TANF Renewal Form. For additional support with requesting large print versions of DFCS applications, please visit . May be translated into languages other than English. For alternative means of communication (e.g., Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language), contact the agency where you applied for benefits if you have a disability requiring such assistance. Those who are deaf or hard of hearing may reach USDA through the Federal Relay Service at 1-800-877-8339. To file a program discrimination complaint, fill out Form AD-3027, which can be obtained online, from any USDA office, by calling, or by writing a letter to USDA. The completed form or letter must include your name, address, phone number, and a detailed description of the alleged discriminatory action. Customers without online access should mail paperwork directly to their local county office. For all other inquiries... To apply, you will need to provide the following information about yourself and household members: Proof of Identity Date of Birth Social Security Number Citizenship or immigration status Employment status and income Criminal background (Examples: probation, parole, felony conviction) Proof of household income (Examples: pay stub, child support payments) Proof of household expenses (Examples: utilities, medical bills, child care receipts). Note: Only provide Social Security Numbers (SSN) and citizenship or immigration status for those applying for benefits. This information will be used to check the income and eligibility verification system (IEVS). We will also match your information against other Federal, state, and local agencies to verify your income and... To keep track of income and work activities, you can share this information with us. If a household member doesn't want to provide their Social Security number or citizenship/immigration status, other members may still receive benefits. For emergency medical services only, no SSN or immigration info is needed. Choose your SNAP renewal form: English or Spanish To renew, go online or visit Georgia Gateway and follow these steps: 1. Create an account or log in with existing info. 2. Fill out the required fields and submit your application. If you need web access, visit any DFCS office lobby. Alternatively, mail your completed form to a local office or drop it off in person during operating hours. Processing time takes up to 30 days. The renewal letter will include the submission date to avoid benefit interruptions. Timely renewals are typically received by the 15th of each month. If you disagree with the decision, request a hearing within 10 days of receiving your eligibility notice. Contact your local office by mail or phone. In accordance with federal law and USDA regulations, we prohibit discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, religion, disability, age, political beliefs, or retaliation for prior civil rights activity. Program information may be available in languages other than English. Individuals with disabilities can request alternative communication methods, while those who are deaf or hard of hearing can contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service. To file a program discrimination complaint, To file a complaint about alleged discriminatory actions, individuals can access the USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form (Form AD-3027) online at pick one up from a local USDA office, or request it by phone at (833) 620-1071. Alternatively, complainants can submit a written letter to the USDA detailing the alleged discriminatory action, including their name, address, and contact information. The letter must provide sufficient details about the incident, including its nature and date.
